

Waiver/exclusion of liability during testing

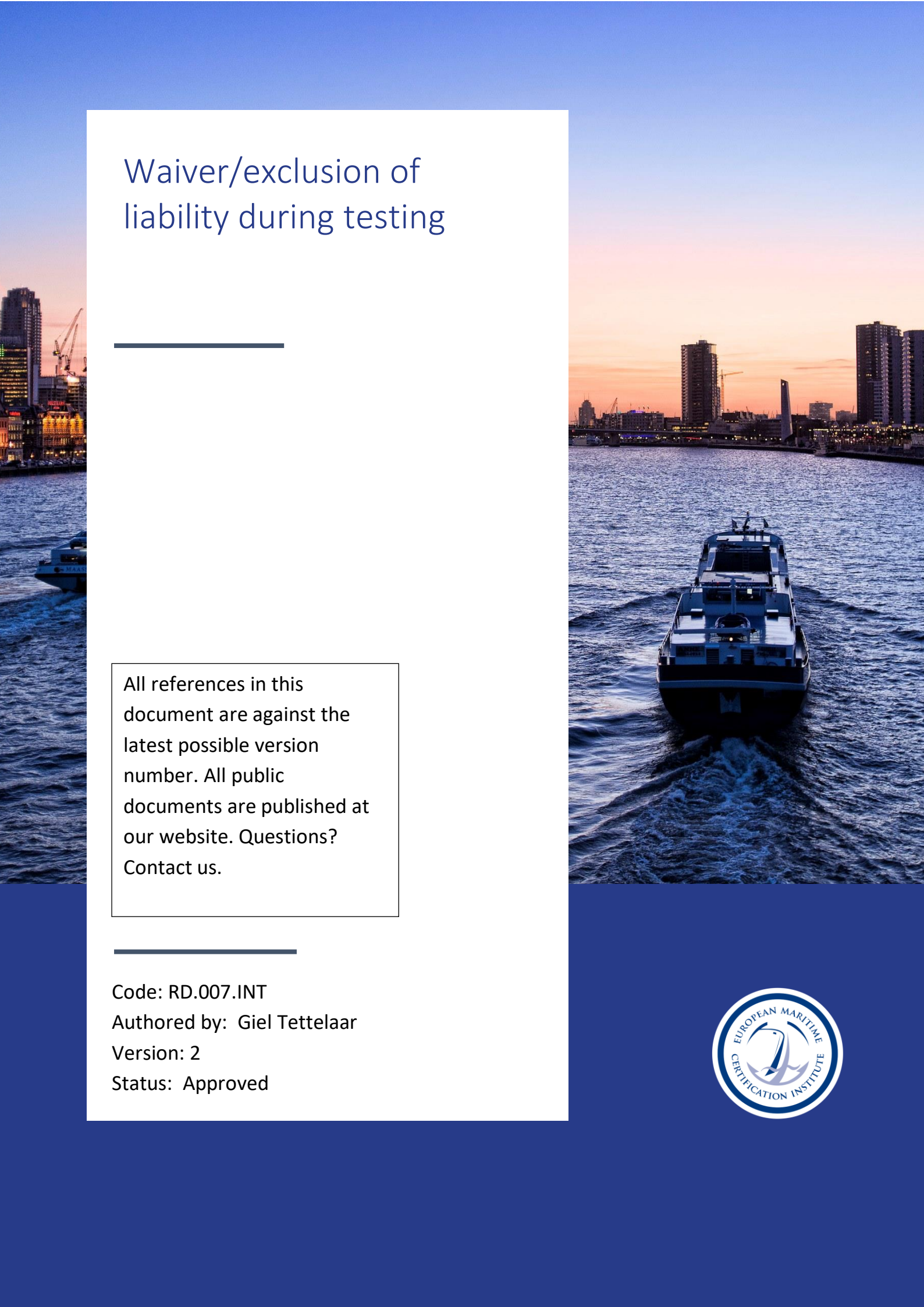
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WAIVER/EXCLUSION LIABILITY DURING TESTING

- 1.** This document is in addition to RD.003 General terms & conditions, that is to be considered as entered and integral to this document.
- 2.** EMCI Register denies, and cannot be held liable, for the performing of tests on or with a product. The client free's EMCI Register of any liability with regards to testing.
- 3.** EMCI Register will only perform tests if required for the certification of a product by a client and these tests will only be performed based on approval of said client through a mutual agreement for certification. These tests will be performed for the risk and account of the client.
- 4.** An agreement is to be considered valid if it was made orally or in writing.
- 5.** The costs of tests are not included in the certification and/or inspection costs, unless additional agreement hereto is made. EMCI Register will charge the costs of performing the tests through to the client additionally.
- 6.** The client is required to have appropriately insured product before tests are performed.
- 7.** EMCI Register does not issue a conformity guarantee with regards to tests. EMCI Register does not guarantee that a test result is in conformity with the applicable essential requirements and/or other criteria/standards and that the product will be approved.
- 8.** If a test leads to the denial of a product up for certification or the product does not meet the requirements the client can choose to deny cooperation for further tests. The client can also alter the product and initiate a repeat test. The costs of all repeat tests are to be borne by the client and are not included in the original agreed upon amount.
- 9.** The client always reserves the right to be present during tests.
- 10.** This document cannot be partially accepted. If this document does not fully or partially cover something, EMCI Register decides.
